The QBA Novice Pairs event is running as I pen this page. There is a strong role up with seventeen tables.


It is great to see our Bridge Club full of happy bridge players. The results are published later in this newsletter.

Gonnie Koster - a tribute

It was with sadness the membership of Sunnybank Bridge Club learned of the passing of our Life Member Gonnie Koster on 7 March 2002. Many members paid tribute to Gonnie at the celebration of her life on 17 March 2022. Gonnie, together with her husband Mike, were long time supporters of Sunnybank Bridge Club. When it came time to build our Clubhouse in 1999/2000 they were extremely generous with their financial support supplying all the steel roof girders, contributing towards the asphaltting of the car park, the purchase of blinds for the windows as well as many other items from time to time. Their generosity did not stop there. On more than one occasion when heavy items had to be transported or lifted, they supplied a company truck together with several able-bodied young men to help with the task to be done.

When we moved into our Clubhouse we needed to fund raise to provide members with the many items required to run a bridge club. To help raise funds a Bring and Buy table was set up. Gonnie was a constant and generous contributor to the Bring and Buy table. Her cakes were delicious, she was a skilled needle woman, but her knitting was outstanding. She particularly knitted Cinderella and Clown dolls and these were very sought after...you had to get in early if you wanted to purchase one of those.

Gonnie continued to enjoy her bridge well into her later years. When she became a little frail it was so good to see her son Barry bring her to the Club to have a game with her. So it is with thanks and sadness that we say Vale to our late Life Member, Gonnie Koster.

Opening lead was the Ace clubs, then 9D to South's KD. AD was then led, followed by a 3rd diamond. Because of South's weak jump overcall, it was obvious that North was out of diamonds, so West trumped high with the 10H.

QH and KH cleared trumps then KC, QC from dummy's hand, tossing 2 spades from declarer's hand. West now has A,Q spades in their hand and lead is in dummy. However, West has paid attention to the Club suit and noted that South played the 9, 10 and J clubs. This makes dummy's 8C a winner, so rather than risk a 'losing' finesse West led the 8C, discarding their QS and making the contract. (Thanks, Richard Spleman).


Find a Partner on Pianola

You may be familiar with Pianola if you get emails from the Club about your results. The Club subscribes to Pianola, an online bridge software application, that offers a range of features including **Partner Finder**.

Step 1 - Login in to [Pianola](#).

If you are logging in for the first time please send an email to either secretary.at.sbc@gmail.com or convenors.at.sbc@gmail.com. You will be sent an invitation to login. You will need to choose a user name and password.

Step 2 - Ensure your contact details are shared




To find a partner, your phone number or email address (or both) must be shared. To check this click on your profile (top right-hand corner), then click on 'My Account', then click on 'Privacy'. Make sure that 'Share my email address' and 'Share my phone number(s)' are ticked. Click on 'Save changes'.

Step 3 - Set up your preferences


If you want to advertise for a Partner, first set up your preferences. Click on 'Preferences'. At first, your preferences will be set to 'Neutral'. You will need to change this to 'Notify'. You can do this for all members, or by individual members. You can also 'block' members who you'd prefer not to partner with. When you're finished setting up your preferences, click on 'Update preference'.

Step 4 - Find or advertise for a partner

Click on Partner Finder.



On this page you will also see who has posted an advert looking for a partner. If you would like to play with one of them, please contact them by email or phone.



To set up your own advert, click on 'Adverts', then click on 'Create a Partner Finder advert'. Use the calendar to select a date then click on 'Save and send emails'.

Step 5 - Cancel an Advert

If you find a partner or change your mind about playing, click on the red X in the top right-hand corner of your advert. Click on 'Found Partner' or 'Delete Advert' and an email will be sent to everyone who is subscribed to you to tell them you no longer need a partner for that game.


